Ziazan participated in over 40 festivals, won 11 awards and received coverage in Washington Post and Monocle. Her 2nd short *Mother Virgin No More / Gri Bölge*'was selected to 65th Berlinale *Generation 14plus Short Film Competition*. The film participated in over 20 festivals and won 2 awards. Both films' world sales-distribution were acquired by Kurz Film Agentur Hamburg. Durmaz is one of 20 filmmakers selected to Toronto Film Festival TALENT LAB 2015. She was selected to the BERLINALE TALENTS 2016 and was one of 4 Talents selected to be portrayed at Deutsche Welle Arts .21 speciale Close-up 2016 - How young filmmakers selected to First Films First Goethe Institute Young Directors Academy South East Europe 2016.

## **SYNOPSIS**

10 year-old Yazidi boy Sefran lives in a refugee camp in Turkey. His family fled there when news broke that ISIS was approaching their town. Imaginative Sefran's favorite thing is watching the suburban bus he calls "The Bus to Amerika" pass by the camp. He dreams about taking off on it to Amerika with his family and becoming a pop star. But one day Sefran's daydreams will turn into nightmares, as he gets accused of eating the forbidden vegetable of their religion, the lettuce. Through the plot of a manipulative boy who has eyes on his girlfriend, Sefran's little mistake turns into a big issue where all the kids of the camp start talking about how he sinned and how his family will be banished because of his sin. Soon Sefran decides he has no choice but to leave the camp to protect his family. Will the journey take him to his dreamland, Amerika or to a place familiar yet unexpected?

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## DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

«The bus to Amerika is a fictional story inspired by my experience of working with Yazidi children in a refugee camp. During my work I learned that eating lettuce was a sin for Yazidis. I was deeply moved by one boy, Kazim's effort of trying to assure me that it was OK for me to eat it; it was about his belief, not mine...

There's an endless religion based war at the other side of Turkey's border. While we also became party to it, my constant feeling for a while has been that 'I cannot breath'. At such a time, Kazim's attitude felt like a breath of fresh air. We live at a time where we are bombarded with instant news and images of tragedy. Consequently, people don't react to human tragedy any more. Therefore I believe we need to change the narrative and create optimistic counterpoints where positive and personal side is present, without ignoring the negative. Through this story which will be told from a boy's perspective, I would like to reach anyone who has their own version of the American dream, who ever cheated a little for something too tasty to give up, who ever had to make a sacrifice for their loved ones and had the courage to face the consequences of their mistakes. When I do so. I hope that the audiences will be able to put themselves in my hero's shoes and realize that 'the refugee' could be anyone, even themselves.» [...]
