Director's statement

Magical realism emerges out of postcolonial societies where there is a conflict between old and new, what is traditional and what is modern. It is the treatment of native and popular beliefs as valid knowledge rather than as exotic folklore. Carissa harnesses the genre's capabilities to render metaphor into veritable existence to tell a tale that invokes a sense of pride and cultural reclamation.

As such, it is a story of enormous importance. It is being written to give voice to a minority of people that modern societies have much to learn from. In our approach, however, we are careful not to romanticise Khoekhoe culture to such an extent that we buy into the trope which indigenous groups are often represented by as wholly unblemished and enlightened custodians of nature. We wish to show a complex picture of modern identity and its foibles as it interweaves with an ancient worldview. Carissa's journey is very much about unpacking these issues and coming to terms with them. Her arc of finding some vestige of her departed mother inside her own self unwittingly brings to the surface more than she bargains for. In the process, she unearths an entire history of ancestors and the mixed feelings of pride and shame that society has foisted upon it.

THE MISSIONARIES

Synopsis

A documentary film team follows a motley crew of South African missionaries who have been tasked with evangelizing the Christian message to a widely secularised Europe. The mission team consists of Ma Florentine, a soft spoken catholic woman in her 60's; Andile "Andy" Ndlovu, a self-professed 'coconut' and energetic young worship leader from an evangelical church; and Benjamin Mahlangu, a disgruntled and sarcastic young artist who has been commissioned to take record of the missionary journey through his art. As the missionaries journey from South Africa to Rome and beyond, they are met with confusion and hostility as to their purpose. It is pointed out to them that they are in the historical founding home of Christianity and that they are preaching to the converted. This sentiment provokes humorous and confrontational interactions around race and history which catapult our characters and those around them on unexpected journeys of self discovery.

Camilla Pontiggia - Director

Camilla Pontiggia is an artist and filmmaker based in Durban, South Africa. Her background in fine arts has given her a keen eye to push creative boundaries of expression and find unusual and disruptive ways to tell stories. She has an ardent passion for creating multidisciplinary work, particularly between filmmaking and the visual arts. At its core her work communicates a profound love for human beings, particularly those on the margins of society. Her work explores the complex spaces that exist within these margins with sensitivity, an occasional dose of rage and a lot of humor. Camilla has written, directed and edited documentaries which have screened both locally and internationally at film festivals in Ghana, Los Angeles and England. Her latest documentary #Am I Next? will be aired on national broadcaster eTV across Africa in 2021. She is currently the writer and director of two of her own feature films, The Missionaries, which was recently one of six films selected for the Jumpstart Script Lab at Durban Filmmart 2020, in partnership with Produire au Sud and the Festival of Three Continents in Nantes, France; and IG GANG, which was selected for development in the KZN Film Commission/Urban Vision 2020/2021 Film Slate.

Michael James - Producer

Michael James is a filmmaker who has written several award winning plays and screenplays; written and directed for television; directed and produced a feature film, Dreams of Gomorrah, which won 3 Simon Sabela Awards in 2020 and is currently being distributed by MNET across all African territories; and directed and produced several short films and documentaries that have gone on to win numerous awards at both local and international film festivals. As the writer, director, and co-producer of his second feature film, Those Who Dwell In Darkness, he has represented the film at the Rotterdam International Film Festival Cinemart 2020, at Durban Filmmart 2019 - where the film won the "Versveld & Associates" Award – and as a shortlisted film at the Cinephilia Bound Filmmart section at the Cannes Film Festival 2020. Currently he is also the producer of a feature filmed entitled The Missionaries, which was recently one of six films selected for the Jumpstart Script Lab at Durban Filmmart 2020, in partnership with Produire au Sud and the Festival of Three Continents in Nantes, France. He is also the producer of another feature film entitled IG GANG, which was selected for development in the KZNFC/Urban Vision 2020/2021 Film Slate.

Director's statement

I grew up with the acute sense that as a South African-Italian who had immigrated back and forth between the continents of Africa and Europe, there was no simple answer when asking myself whose prodigal child I could comfortably claim to be. I had been made too aware of the complexities of race and colonial history, too aware of the power and function of whiteness that had created for itself a centre around which all other races had to either fit or be othered; too aware of a European whiteness in particular that absolved itself of its colonial complicity in shaping our world today and that maintained a narrative of racial homogeneity. Since then I have been trying to make sense of who we are as humans across these two continents. As a white person, being very aware of my position in society, The Missionaries is one such exploration that is very close to my heart. It is a satire that intends in every way to subvert the dominant narratives we are handed about our histories, our races, and our present as two continents, and turn them on their heads through a reversal of the European missionary narrative to Africa. Aided by disruptive storytelling tools such as the mockumentary style, which satirically blurs the lines between reality and fiction, and a colour-filled visual aesthetic defined by the character Benjamin's artistic inner life, The Missionaries is an unapologetic, defiant expression of humour and warmth that works to uncover our deepest humanity.

Synopsis

Zenande (a feisty but naïve, inventive storyteller) 11, and her secretive friend Thobeka 13, have bonded over their common dream to go to the "Oprah Winfrey School" in Kokstad (Seven Fountains Primary School). When Thobeka is fetched by her mother from the orphanage where they both live; Zenande is heartbroken. She escapes to go find herself a mother, a particular mother! She's convinced that a rich mother will enroll her at the Oprah School. Zenande finds her biological mother Zoleka. She is overwhelmed as Zoleka is poor, definitely not the mother she wants. She finds a wealthy woman, Priscilla; who fits Zenande's description of a perfect mother. Zenande worms her way into Priscilla's life... and heart. She moves into Priscilla's house. They bond, but Priscilla feels no connection to Zenande. She finds Zenande's true mother. Zenande refuses to accept this and runs from Priscilla's house. When Priscilla finds her she forces Zenande to face and accept her. Zenande shows Priscilla that she too has to face her own truth. Priscilla ultimately takes Zenande in. Turns out the school is for children from disadvantaged backgrounds - Zenande has a rich mother now, she doesn't gualify!

Reem Morsi - Director

Reem Morsi worked as a professional scuba diving & human rights officer prior to becoming a filmmaker. Reem's first feature film as writer/director/producer, "Hysteria" is currently in post-production (Telefilm Canada Talent to Watch production with support from the CFC/Netflix Accelerator Program & Canada Arts Council). She is currently in production on her second feature film, the action/drama "The Last Mark", November 2020. Morsi's feature film script, Bootleg, received a scriptwriting grant from the San Francisco Film Society (2016) & won the Telefilm Canada New Voices Award (2017). Morsi has participated in the Berlinale Talents & Script Station (2012 & 2018) & TIFF (2016) Talent Labs, CFC's Directors' & WIDC Director's labs in 2014/2015. THE KILLING OF A BEAST

A VUSI AFRICA FILM

Synopsis

This is not a dream but her reality ; It's been 20 years since Nora Manzana's younger brother drowned. The memory of her brother's death still haunts her even today , whenever she sees water she's reminded of how her brother drowned. No one in Nora's family swims since that incident, they all fear that the water snake that swallowed Khumi will swallow them. Years later that fear still follows Nora and now she has transferred it to her son who has to join all the boys whom are coming of age, to the killing of the beast ceremony which is said to take place under water. Nora's son Thabiso drowns at the killing of the beat and dies. No one can find his body but her own mother, who has to face the fear of water and dive into the abyss.

Director's statement

Since the dawn of democracy the practice of the killing of a beast ceremony has been subject to abuse. In many instances it has resulted into the death of initiates as well as serious bodily harm. Since 1994 over 1100 initiates have died at the killing of the beast ceremony in the western cape region of South Africa. The government has also not placed measures and legislature to regulate initiation practices or call for the disregard of current laws. Many traditional chiefs have operated unregulated initiation practices however without any laws regulating the custom, there's no distinction between legitimate and illegitimate initiation ritual. Modern medication is not allowed at the killing of the beast initiation resulting in further deterioration of health conditions. My conclusion is that cultural practices which are harmful to life contravene the norms of society and must be changed sooner. In terms of the constitution of the Republic of South Africa , everyone has the right to life. That right cannot be sacrificed at the altar of culture and politics. There is a serious health crisis that is going on in South Africa in relation to the ritual of circumcision or better known according to its respectful term as the "Killing of A Beast". The government must act to prevent the continued mass murder of young boys all in the name of manhood and respect.

As a film student two of his films were selected for broadcast by Star Sat which broadcast across Southern , East and sub-Saharan Africa.
